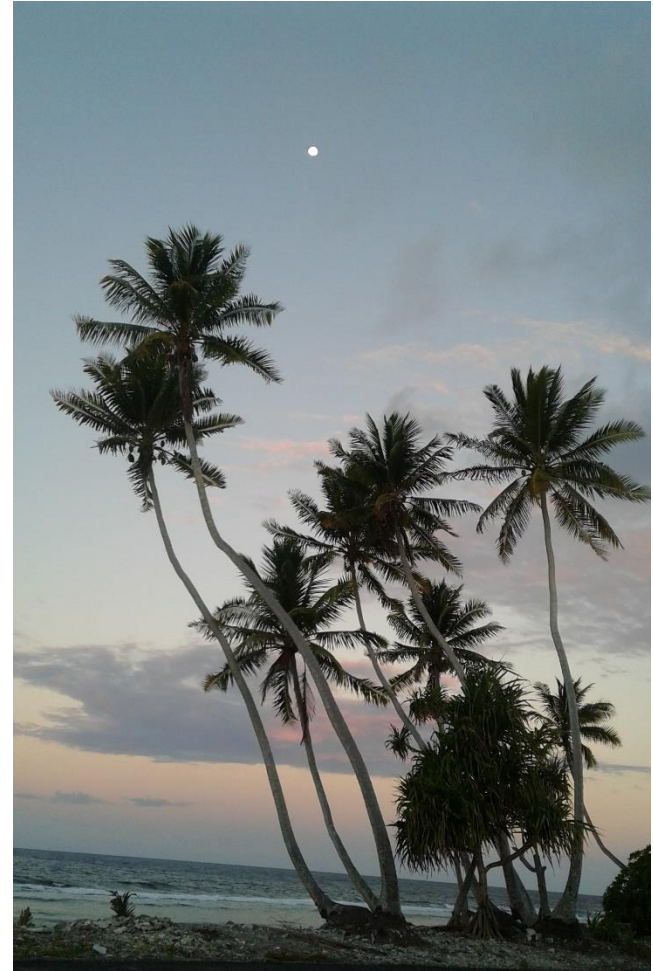

Who is SPREP?

SPREP was established in 1993 with the mandate -

To promote cooperation in the Pacific region and provide assistance in order to protect and improve its environment and to **ensure sustainable development** for present and future generations

- The Pacific regional agency for the environment.
- Recognised as the lead on biodiversity, climate change, waste management and **environmental monitoring and governance** in the Pacific Region
- Focus on strengthening partnerships and cooperation among Pacific Island countries & territories.

SPREP Members

- 26 member countries
21 Pacific Island countries & territories, 5 'metropolitan' states (AU, NZ, FR, USA & UK)
- SPREP is fully accountable to member governments through SPREP Meeting(SM) every two years under the new Strategic Plan
- SM every two years with EB Meeting every alternate year
